Autumn Heroes and Villains	- Children can say the days of the week in order. - Using the visual timetable children can say what is happening 'now' and 'next'. - Children can tell you about a past experience in their own life in the correct tense e.g. 'I went down the slide.'	- Children know the sequence of animals that grow from eggs- egg → baby → adult (sequence). - Florence Nightingale was a nurse who changed the way hospitals run. They are now clean and patients are well looked after.	- Guy Fawkes was caught trying to blow up the houses of parliament when King James was inside. - Bonfire Night is on the 5th of November each year to remember this event. - Children know the sequence of animals that grow from eggs- egg → baby → adult (sequence). (this is a recap from nursery- check key knowledge in provision / independent activity)	- A fire started on Pudding Lane in London in 1666, the fire spread quickly because the houses were made of wood and the streets were narrow. - There were no fire engines in 1666, people used leather buckets to throw water at the fire but it did not go out. - The fire service started because of the great fire of London. - Guy Fawkes was caught trying to blow up the houses of parliament when King James was inside. (this is just key knowledge for Y1, Bonfire night is covered in classes 4,5 and 6 and within the heroes and villains topic in classes 7, 8, 9 and 10.)

Spring What a wonderful world	- Children know the sequence of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and can say what happens 'first' 'next' 'last'. - Children name the sequence of the lifecycle of a plant. Seed → stalk and leaves → flowering.	- In 1770 Captain James Cook discovered the Great Barrier Reef. - Captain James Cook was the first person to cross the Antarctic circle.	- Ernest Shackleton wanted to be the first person to cross Antarctica so he set up an expedition in 1914. - They got stuck in the ice in 1915 and they did not think they would survive. - A small crew lead by Shackleton found help and they were all saved. - Ships have changed a lot since 1914 they are not usually made of wood anymore and are powered by engines not wind. (just reception, this is part of the history MTP for Y1).	- In 1903, two brothers from named Wilbur and Orville Wright, known as the Wright Brothers were successful in flying an airplane they built. It was the first powered flight. - Over time aeroplanes have changed a lot. - In 1908 they built the first plane that could carry a passenger.
